



Wills & Bequests

Including Mercy Flight Western New York in your will or revocable trust is an easy way to show your support for our mission. If you've already written your will, your attorney can prepare a simple document, called a codicil, to add a new bequest to your will. Likewise, your attorney can also easily prepare an amendment to your revocable trust. Bequests may enable your estate to realize significant tax savings - we suggest that you discuss this with your financial advisor.

Your attorney can help you draft the right wording for you, but here are a few examples:

SPECIFIC BEQUEST

"I give and bequeath to Mercy Flight Inc., a not-for-profit organization located at 100 Amherst Villa Road, Buffalo, New York, the sum of \$ _____ to be used for its general purposes."

RESIDUAL BEQUEST

"I give and bequeath to Mercy Flight Inc., a not-for-profit organization located at 100 Amherst Villa Road, Buffalo, New York, _____% of my residual estate to be used for its general purposes."

RESTRICTED BEQUEST

If you would prefer that your gift be used to support a particular part of our mission, please contact us for assistance in identifying something specific to insert in place of "general purposes." A few examples are: *Helicopter purchase and maintenance, specialized medical equipment, flight crew salaries or training*

OTHER BEQUESTS

You may also bequest Mercy Flight other assets like stocks, bonds or retirement plans. Or you could designate Mercy Flight as the beneficiary of a life insurance policy.
